Ordinance no 3/2018 of Vice Dean of the Faculty of Biology

of June 19, 2018

on the principles of teaching practice for PhD students at the Faculty of Biology at the Jagiellonian University.

§ 1

- 1. PhD students at the Faculty of Biology at the Jagiellonian University are obliged to complete teaching practice in the form of teaching /co-teaching* classes or participation** in classes.
- 2. PhD students may be entrusted with teaching or co-teaching courses (classes, field courses, workshops (practicum), laboratory classes, discussion classes, helping in conducting specialised practical classes) at higher education study programmes.
- 3. With the consent of the Director on Educational Affairs, PhD students at the Faculty of Biology can teach courses designed for students.
- 4. The classes that must be taught by a PhD student as a part of their teaching practice are assigned by the Director on Educational Affairs who consults the doctoral advisor/supervisor of a PhD student.
- *Co-teaching active participation in teaching courses run by an academic teacher e.g. helping with microscopic observations, laboratory classes, field classes, preparing teaching materials ...
- **Participation participation in classes referred to in § 1.2 as an observer.

§ 2

1. Obligatory workload and form of teaching practice for the full PhD study programme:

PHD STUDENTS, YEAR I

- merely participate in classes taught by an academic teacher and attend classes developing their teaching skills;
- observe minimum 10 hours of classes, after which they write a report and have it signed by a course coordinator or their doctoral advisor. The report template constitutes Appendix 1 hereto.

PHD STUDENTS, YEAR II - IV:

- independently teach classes;
- co-teaching is possible only with prior consent of the Dean on Educational Affairs

PHD STUDENTS WITH PROLONGED COURSE OF STUDIES (AFTER YEAR IV)

- are not obliged to do teaching practice unless the Director on Educational Affairs decides otherwise pursuant to principles for PhD students without a doctoral scholarship.
- 2. The yearly obligatory workload is specified in the study programmes:
- 10-60 hours PhD student with a doctoral scholarship,
- 10-30 hours PhD student without a doctoral scholarship.

- 3. PhD student does not receive remuneration for teaching classes within their obligatory teaching practice.
- 4. A doctoral advisor/ supervisor shall observe classes taught by a student at least once in an academic year. The observed classes are later discussed with the PhD student and followed by a written report by the doctoral advisor/supervisor, called *PhD student's teaching practice record*, containing their assessment of the observed classes. A template for *PhD student's teaching practice record* constitutes Appendix 2 hereto. A PhD student shall submit *PhD student's teaching practice record* together with their annual report form.

§ 3

All matters not settled herein shall be resolved by the Dean of the Faculty of Biology.

§ 4

This Ordinance shall enter into force on the day it is signed and shall apply to the academic year 2018/2019.
