

Personal data protection

Pursuant to Article 13 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter: GDPR), Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. **The Controller** of your personal data is Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by JU Rector.
2. **Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Officer** at ul. Gołębia 24, 30-007 Kraków, room no 5. The Officer can be contacted via email: iod@uj.edu.pl or by phone at 12 663 12 25, from Monday to Friday between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m.
3. Your personal data provided in the call entry will be processed:
 - a. in the case of all Participants – for the **purpose of launching and conducting the Call** (hereinafter: the Call) pursuant to Article 6.1.f of the GDPR, i.e. for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller, which consists in naming the laureate of the Call with whom an agreement is subsequently concluded.
 - b. in the case of Participant who is the author of the work awarded in the Call: for the purpose of legal obligations imposed on the Call Operator as the authority promising the award, including in particular the tax obligations, i.e. pursuant to Article 6.1.c of the GDPR.
4. While providing your personal data is voluntary, it is a necessary prerequisite for taking part in the Call. Not providing personal data precludes participation in the Call. In the case of Participants referred to under point 3.b above, providing the data constitutes a legal obligation, and failing to provide them shall preclude awarding the Participant.
5. Personal data of the Participants referred to under point 3.a will not be made available to entities outside the Call Operator's staff.
6. Personal data of the Participants referred to under point 3.b above, may be published on the Call Operator's website, and they may be published in its social media for the purposes of designating authorship of the awarded work and honouring the author's moral rights, These data will also be made available to authorised public authorities, including, in particular, to the extent that these authorities are authorised to verify the fulfilment of the legal obligations imposed on the Call Operator as the authority promising the award.
7. Your personal data shall not be transferred to third countries (outside the EEA) / to international organisations.
8. Personal data of the Participants referred to under point 3.a above shall be processed until the Call is concluded and its results made known.

Personal data of the Participants referred to under point 3.b above shall be processed in the period resulting from fiscal regulations, and subsequently, for archiving purposes, pursuant to applicable legal regulations. These data will continue to be processed pursuant to the agreement concluded with the laureates of the Call.

9. You have the following rights: to obtain information on personal data processing and rights resulting from the GDPR, to access your data and rectify them, as well as to have them deleted from the controller's database (unless further processing is necessary for fulfilling a legal obligation or for the purposes of determining, pursuing, or defending claims), to limit their processing or transfer, and to object to the processing of the data – in the cases and under the conditions specified in the GDPR.
10. Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision making or profiling.
11. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection, should you ascertain that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.
